


## The Post-COVID-19 Workplace





### **Best Practices: People**

### worktop screens Guidelines

- Quick deploy and easily removable provides maximum flexibility.
- Reconsider workstation use in ways that best achieve the distancing goals.
- Rethink shared and unassigned chairs and tech accessories.
- Consider assigning shared desks to individuals for a full day or a week.
- Encourage workers to keep desk clean, to support cleaning guidelines.

## Insights

- Floor screens can provide a simple, inexpensive way to quickly establish new foot traffic patterns on the floor plate.
- They can control movement in and out of a setting, or provide a boundary between a walkway and a setting in use.

## **Immediate Suggestions**





### FLOOR SCREENING Guidelines

- Six-foot social distancing rule should be applied.
- Consider antimicrobial materials where appropriate.
- Remove extra chairs in chairs in collaborative spaces.
- Easily deployable and movable.
- Screens should not impede thorough cleaning of the floor or impact air circulation.

## Insights

## Insights


- WFH will continue to be an important part of reopening the workplace.

## Insights


- Personal hygiene is fundamental.

## Immediate Suggestions





### HYGIENE Guidelin<u>es</u>

- Communicate CDC recommendations on personal hygiene and corporate expectations in the workplace.
- Provide disinfectant wipes, hand sanitizer and tissues.
- Have masks readily available.
- No-touch garbage and recycling receptacles are preferable.
- Ramp up custodial cleaning.
- Consider making gloves available near high touch devices.



## **Current Recommendations**

### Today, the World Health Organization:

- DOES NOT recommend the use of UVC germicide irradiation for reason of feasibility and safety (except for deep cleaning practices in health care settings, or in safety installed enclosed air ventilations systems).
- DOES recommend increasing ventilation in all setting to reduce the transmission of the virus.





### STERILIZATION

## **Sterilization Exploration**

There is renewed interest in the use of UV-c light to kill pathogens in the air and on high touch surfaces in the workplace, such as keyboards, mice and phones.

Herman Miller is working with industry leaders to better understand the state of UV light technology and the feasibility of extending its use.
