### President's Message

As we look forward to 2019, there is a lot of uncertainty about our economy, locally as well as nationally and internationally.

The stock markets saw a crazy November and December, with some substantial drops in value, including high performers such as Apple. Home prices have stabilized and even dropped slightly, with real estate sales taking about 50% longer than in 2017 and housing costs keep rising faster than incomes. Trade relations with China remain strained. Politics in Washington remain a mess.

Don't panic! Other indicators are strong, especially here in California and LA County.

Locally, unemployment rates are very low and average wages have grown by more than \$120 per week since the second quarter of 2018. The largest sectors of job growth have been in leisure and hospitality, health services and professional and business services.

While average incomes in Southern California have risen by about 10% in the past five years, consumer spending has risen more than 20%. In Riverside, LA, Orange and San Bernardino county, average annual consumer spending rose by \$11,659 to \$66,971.

There is much uncertainty among trading partners, but the number of containers entering through the Ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles have remained relatively stable, year over year. With one in eight jobs in Southern California in some way related to logistics and the ports, this indicates continued strength in the industry, and good news for those whose jobs are dependent on imports and exports.

We are seeing some adjustments, even some that can seem disconcerting or even scary. However, all in all, the economy seems to still be growing, especially in segments important to those of us in Southern California.

We are part of a larger global economy, but we must also continue concentrate on what is happening locally.
