President's Message

The Pasadena Chamber is working with our **Pasadena Unified School District** College and Career Pathway office to help place interns again this summer. Working with academies at Blair High School, Muir High School, Pasadena High School and Rose City, we are coordinating intern placements.

This follows another successful year facilitating job shadow opportunities and business people and professionals to speak in classrooms. The Chamber's Workforce Development Director, Amy Foell, also meets regularly with instructional teams at each school and PUSD administrators.

All interns place by the Chamber are juniors (rising to seniors next year) who have successfully engaged with one of the academy programs. Students are sixteen to seventeen years-old. Each has been through an interview process and gets extensive training.

Young people that we place understand workplace dress and behavior, ethics and customer service. Students are required to be punctual, appropriately dressed and be ready to work. Students will be monitored throughout their internship experience and also have to attend a weekly internship class with PUSD.

Placing interns with appropriate work-based learning opportunities is a new challenge for the Chamber. We are hoping to work with our membership to place students in challenging and meaningful work experiences.

Host companies need not pay the students, though we are hoping some stipend is available. The Chamber is working on securing a separate funding source to compensate students we place.

The intern experience is important to the students, as they have a chance to explore the working world, see how companies are run and learn what education and experience are required for different types of employment and careers.

It is also important for the host company. Companies get the value of having young, fresh energy and perspectives, as well as energy and enthusiasm a young person can bring to the workplace.

Pasadena Chamber Inaugural Gala July 7th at Langham Huntington Hotel Pasadena




This year, the Chamber celebrates the installation of Robin McCarthy of Fire Family



Host a Summer Intern and Support Pasadena Youth

The Pasadena Chamber of Commerce is entering it's third year placing Pasadena Unified School District 11th graders into meaningful summer internships. Our program is growing exponentially as we have been tasked with identifying over 130 placements for students interested in engineering and environmental science, technology, health, law and public service and business. Internships give students insight into career possibilities and shape their major in college.

Thankfully we have a strong base of return hosts such as the Ronald McDonald House, Health Advantage Physical Medicine, Pasadena Service Federal Credit Union, Vroman's Bookstore, AccessorEyes Optometry, Keck Medicine of USC -Pasadena and the Law Offices of Donald P. Schweitzer. But we need more businesses participating to meet the current needs of this popular program.

What are the program requirements you may ask?

- Qualified businesses must not work from home or alone.
- Be able to provide at least 60 hours of on-the-job training to gain relevant knowledge and professional skills of a particular industry. Provide an internships starting in June and end by the second week of August.

Pasadena Unified School District provides liability insurance for all the student interns. Student interns take an online class in conjunction with their internship as a graduation requirement. Ideally, we'd prefer participating businesses to pay their intern or contribute \$250 towards a stipend upon successful completion of the program. Hosts will not be turned away for lack of funds.


